## FACT SHEET

- Hunger remains an ongoing problem in North Texas and nationally.
- In FY23, the North Texas Food Bank provided access to 144 million meals, the most ever annually in the organization's history. *(source: NTFB)*
- 29% of North Texas Food Bank clients are from Hispanic/Latino communities *(source: NTFB)*
- Hispanics/Latinos are 2.5x more likely to experience food insecurity than white individuals. *(source: Feeding America)*
- 18% of Latino children experienced food insecurity in 2021. *(source: Feeding America)*
- Hispanics are driving population growth in Texas, with an increase of 33% from 2010. *(source: The Concilio 2020 State of Latinos Report)*
- DFW ranked 6<sup>th</sup> for the largest Latino population in the U.S. *(source: The Concilio 2020 State of Latinos Report)*

- Companies and groups participate in a friendly competition to raise funds, secure donated food, and volunteer their time.
- This year's goal is to raise \$50,000 (equal to 150,000 nutritious meals), collect 1,000 pounds of food, and register 300 volunteer hours at the North Texas Food Bank.
